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We'll be working with inks. Bear that in mind as you choose your wardrobe.

	equired ks & Stuff
	Tsukineko ink workstation (available at the Quilt Patch) or other collection of Tsukineko inks and Fantastix applicators (two for each color). Aloe Gel with no colors added. I found mine in the pharmacy section of my
	Palette or collection of small dishes. We'll use these to mix the gel and the ink. If you have a palette knife or a stirrer, that's a bonus. Miscellaneous paintbrushes. Include medium, small, and really small.
W (ork Area & Gear et up my work area with two Teflon or non-stick craft sheets. I put one under
	rinks and one under my fabric. When I'm using the inks straight, I put my bric on a Grip & Grip.
	A way to keep your fabric taut and easy to work with. I highly recommend a Grip & Grip , a sticky mat that adheres to your work surface and your fabric without the use of adhesives. If you don't have one, then you can use tape and a piece of cardboard or other stiff work surface.
	Paper Towels (just in case)
_	Scrap muslin to use as a rubbing cloth. Bring at least one piece at least 10" square.
	For fabric, you really have choices. For plain fabric , PFD (prepared for dyeing) fabric is nice. You could also bring other smooth, high thread count light colored fabric. I like white to play on. It really lets the colors shine. Prewash if you wish, but it's not necessary. Remember, you're learning a new technique, not producing a masterpiece. At least 4 white (or light) 10"-12" squares

	Scotch Tape or other clear tape (We're going to label your Fantastix) Fine point Sharpie Marker or some other marker that can write on plastic At least one Pigma or Zig (or other fabric) marker in black We're going to play with coloring in shapes and pictures. You can either bring fabrics (white) with outlined shapes or you can bring white fabric and simple rubber stamps with black ink. Or you can bring it all. I'll also have motifs

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you can trace onto your fabric using a Pigma pen. If you have simple line drawings you'd like to trace, bring them. Dover books are great for this.
